## Going Up, Going Down

For every Jew to get to Israel at least once in a lifetime is an incomparable mitzvah. The very language that we use to describe a voyage to Israel is of a spiritual journey, aliyah, literally ascending. While the journey there from the elevation of Cape Cod is literally an ascent, it is so much more, an elevation of our souls, awakening the dormant pieces of our Jewish selves that slumber in the Diaspora. Looking back on the trip that twenty-two of us made in February, there are a few episodes that I will treasure, the moments that lifted me up in a way that can only happen in Israel.

Sharing a first glimpse of Jerusalem with so many who looked upon it with new eyes is unforgettable. Seeing our ancient and modern home, our object of longing made real and bustling with life, brings a tear to my eyes every time. I saw the same tears in many eyes gazing upon our holiest site. At first glance, it was home.

We shared Sunday morning havdalah with the First and Second graders at the Leo Baeck School in Haifa. The Leo Baeck School is a Reform Jewish institution that has reached out to the poor of Haifa, has created the best academic school in Haifa and teaches religious pluralism. First a high school, then a middle school and now with a new elementary program, the Leo Baeck School prepares students that are the future of Israel. Being with the kids reminded me of the real miracle of modern Israel, the resurgence and growth of our people.

With my son we walked through the Jerusalem open air market. To see Rafael in the city of his birth surrounded by the crush of humanity in the hours before Shabbat, excited by every discovery and overflowing bounty at every stall was fantastic. The market was our stop after *Yad Vashem*, the *Shoah* memorial and research center. There is no more potent reminder that *am yisrael chai*, the people of Israel live. As the great Israeli poet, Yehuda Amichai, wrote in his poem, *Tourists*,

*I said to myself: redemption will come only if their guide tells them,  
"You see that arch from the Roman period? It's not important: but  
next to it, left and down a bit, there sits a man who's bought fruit and  
vegetables for his family."*

Being back on the Cape, having gone through *yeridah*, the *descent*, I was soon asked by many of our members when we would make our next trip. Each successive congregational trip builds our community ties to the land and people of Israel. I was reminded again and again in Israel of how much we need Israel and how much Israel needs us.

The American and Israeli communities are in a relationship of mutual support. They need us to help develop pluralism, to sustain their economy, and to advocate for Israel in the international arena. How do we need Israel? We need Israel to remind us of who we are. In this one corner of the world we are a proud, independent majority, the sole authors of our fate. We are the people who survived two millennia of dispersion and built a new state in our ancient land. We are the people who have gathered in Jews from around the world and brought them home, a home that every Jew in the world can claim as his or her own.

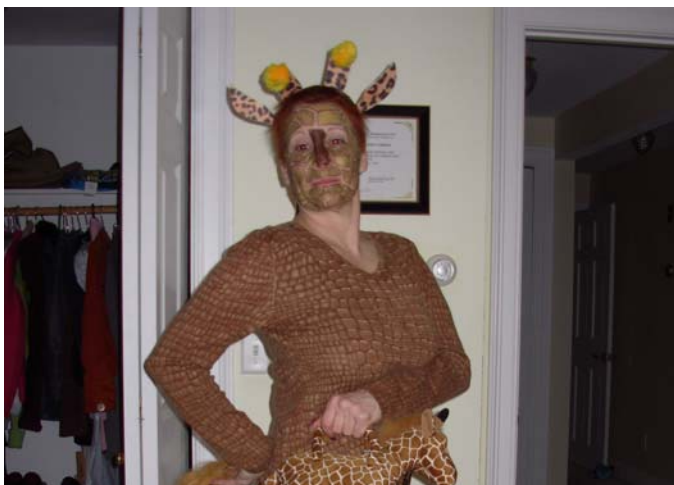

## RITUAL COMMITTEE INSIGHTS

Our Jewish calendar moves along.

The next holiday we celebrate is Passover. Please join us at our congregational home to retell and relive the story of the Exodus and our redemption as a people, to share a marvelous traditional Seder meal, prayer and song with your family and friends. Our Seder meal is prepared by a group of very dedicated volunteers who take great pride in all the details of the Seder.

Attend a Service and accept an honor from one of our Committee members. One of the Honors is undressing and redressing the Torah. Here are the steps to follow.

Remove the rimmonim, the finials at the top of the Torah roller, and put them on the spindles rack. Then remove the breastplate, hang it on one spindle, hand the yad, pointer, to the Rabbi or service leader and slide the mantle off and place it on the rack. The Rabbi will place the Torah on the reading desk. Once you have completed this task, you will return later to reverse the process.

At the end of the reading, the Torah is lifted and carried away from the reading desk. Then you return and put the band on first. Do remember that the Torah is facing the person holding it, so everything needs to go back on facing away from you. Most important, don't panic as the President or Board representative sitting on the Bimah will help.

## THE ARZA RABBINIC COUNCIL IN ACTION

There is a group of Reform rabbis, numbering over 150, whose love of Israel is so strong, and whose desire to teach that love to

their congregants is so deep, that they have decided to join the ARZA Rabbinic Council. ARZA (that's the Association of Reform Zionists of America - and remember that it's pronounced "AHR-tza") is the Reform Movement's national Zionist organization, and its primary mission is to make Israel a core part of the sacred identity of every American Jew. Anyone can join ARZA. Membership dues are only \$36 annually for a household. But the rabbis of the Rabbinic Council are those who make an additional significant contribution to ARZA to support the kinds of programs that help connect Reform Jews to Israel. Here's one example: At the 2007 URJ Biennial in San Diego, the ARZA Rabbinic Council underwrote an important address by Rabbi Donniel Hartman. Rabbi Hartman is an Orthodox rabbi living in Israel whose thoughts, observations, and analysis of Israeli society are radical and refreshing. Responding to those Reform Jews who focus constantly on the Israeli Rabbinic prohibition of wedding ceremonies performed by non-Orthodox rabbis, Hartman told us not to get so worked up over it. "Instead," he counseled [though this is not a direct quote], "get some money together and buy a boat, one with six wedding chapels and six reception halls. Every Tuesday at noon, the boat will sail from Ashdod (the port city south of Tel Aviv). As soon as it's out in international waters, they'll have six weddings, with terrific parties, and it'll be back in port that evening. It'll fill up. Fast. Soon you'll have to buy a second boat, to accommodate the crowds." What he was really talking about was not weddings or rabbis or boats, but how Reform Jews should be striving to "own" our place and participation in Israeli society. The message was surprising, thought-provoking, and unexpected. And it was made possible by ARZA's Rabbinic Council.

### Join the Rabbinic Council

ARZA's Rabbinic Council is comprised of Reform Rabbis committed to strengthening the relationship between their colleagues and Israel and their congregants and Israel. The advancement of Reform Zionism and knowledge of Israel in North America will help fulfill ARZA's mission to aid in creating an Israeli pluralistic society so that all Jews have a voice.
