Yom Ha'atzma'ut

These are trying times for American Zionists. The Israeli Knesset is debating a bill that would change the status of Jews outside of Israel, no longer recognizing conversions officiated by non-Orthodox rabbis. This is only part of the ultra-Orthodox grip tightening on Israeli law and policy. The peace process with the Palestinians is moribund, in part because of Israeli coalition politics that continue to push settlement expansion. The same politics have led to a low point in Israeli-American relations unseen in 20 years. Having lived in Israel during Benjamin Netanyahu's first government, the current disarray looks like an instant replay. His tenuous grip on power is maintained by an overly large governing coalition, each component of which is acting in its own short-term interests. Recent polls of the Israeli public indicate growing numbers who feel that whatever Israel does the rest of the world will disapprove, so why not act as they will? And if things weren't tough enough, Iran is getting ever closer to nuclear weapons. Happy 62nd Birthday, Israel!

We live in interesting times. Is this a reason to celebrate? Strangely enough, yes. We are uniquely blessed among all the generations of Jews from the time of Shimon Bar Kokchba in the 2nd Century until the present. Despite any tensions, challenges, and outright troubles we may face in Israel, they are *our* troubles. If there are mistakes in Israeli policy, they are our mistakes, made for our own reasons and with our own free will, not because of the imposition of others. We will sink or swim by our own devices and by our own merits, a realization of the hope of *Hatikva*, "To be a free people in our own land." Such freedom is truly a gift to be thankful for and to celebrate. This is the freedom that has created the amazing ferment that is Israeli society. All of the tensions and contradictions are matched by a startling creativity and ingenuity that stand alone in the world. Technology, medicine, industry and the arts flourish in our people's homeland in a fashion that is the envy of much of the world. Israel is an unequivocal world leader.

To learn more of what we celebrate and how vital Israel is to our future as a people, I encourage you to come and hear the reflections of our congregants who traveled to Israel on our last two community trips. We will celebrate *Yom Ha'atzma'ut*, Israel Independence Day, with song and memory at our Shabbat service on April 16. I tell everyone who makes a first time trip to Israel that they will probably be surprised by what they take away from their experience.

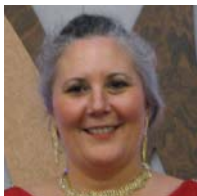

Where there is no bread, there is no Torah

A few months ago, a local professional brought the vital needs of one of our congregants of our attention. Our Board took on the responsibility of support for this member of our community. In keeping with Jewish law, we brought food. The real lesson in this is that there are probably others in our community making choices between food and medicine or other necessary items.

For the past couple of summers, we have had a very successful program at our Wednesday Night Movies suggesting an *admission price* of a non-perishable food product for donation to the local food bank. The program has been a wonderful success. We have donated significantly to this worthy cause. Certainly we never turned anyone away from the free movies who might come without a food contribution, but most did come with a can or box of food for those who are in need.

If we can do this for the larger community, surely we can support our own. Please consider contributing to this. Bring a non-perishable item to services. Send something in with the kids on Sunday or to Hebrew School. Or stop in yourself just to drop something off.

Having rebuilt our front hallway which leads to the Office and the beautiful new bathrooms, we will utilize an odd little space to create a *Tzedakah Closet*. Please contribute to this important effort.

If the market has a 10 for \$10 offer, think about getting 10 of the items and bring 5 to the *Tzedakah Closet*. If you'd purchase buy-one-get-one-free items anyway, how about putting the free one into the closet? If you're at the check-out counter and feel so moved, get a \$5, \$10 or \$20 gift card.

The most important part of a useful *Tzedakah Closet* is going to be the willingness of those who need it to make use of it. If you or someone you know could use a break, could use a helping hand, please contact Rabbi Freelund. Your conversation will be completely confidential. Sometimes a bag of groceries can mean the difference between paying a bill or not, being able to get a tank of gas. In *Pirkei Avot* it says, *Where there is no bread, there is no Torah*.

It feels really good to think of The Cape Cod Synagogue as a place where we can be of such immediate and material help and where we can ask for help and receive a compassionate and confidential response.

Include a description of how the criteria have been met and a short discussion of why the applicant is deserving of this \$200.00 scholarship.

- Passover is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate with children. The home-oriented holiday stresses the importance of family, children, food and storytelling.
- To make the holiday more child-oriented, here are some suggestions. To prepare for Passover, read a book together, look for the *chametz* even if you don't choose to follow this strictly. A modified *chametz* search can be fun and effective to teach young children the difference between the food we eat on Passover and the food we eat the rest of the year. Use a cloth napkin to make a *matza* cover and decorate it with sponge painted Jewish stars or other shapes. Make a stained glass *Kiddush* cup with tissue paper. Make a *matza* or *Seder* plate, make *afikomen* bags, make a tablecloth.
- Cook together. *Charoset* and macarons are easy. Choose a *Hagadah* that is right for your family. If your child is ready, learn the four questions and encourage children to ask questions during the *Seder*. Keep a supply of paper and crayons at the *Seder* table. Use costumes, puppets or masks to help tell the story. Run a simultaneous stuffed animal/doll *Seder*.

RITUAL COMMITTEE INSIGHTS

To all our volunteers who made our Passover *Seder* a success, a special thank you for their dedication and hard work. So much goes into the planning and preparation for such a beautiful event. We joke at our Ritual meetings that food seems to be one of our most important topics. Food is a part of our heritage, and events such as this bring our families and congregants together.

Yom HaShoa, Holocaust Remembrance Day, was established in 1959 by Israeli law by David Ben-Gurion, Prime Minister. Commemorations range from synagogue services to communal vigils and educational programs. Many *Yom HaShoah* programs feature talks given by Holocaust survivors, recitation of appropriate psalms, songs and readings or viewings of a Holocaust theme film. In Israel, on the eve of *Yom HaShoah* the Holocaust Martyrs and Heroes Authority holds a state ceremony at Yad Vashem. On that day, at 10 AM, sirens sound throughout Israel for two minutes. Public transport, including virtually all highway vehicles, comes to a standstill. People stop and stand silent. All flags on public buildings are flown at half mast.

Our *Yom HaShoah* observance will be Sunday, April 11, at 7:30 PM.

Yom Ha'atzma'ut, Israel Independence Day, celebrates the declaration of the State of Israel by David Ben-Gurion in Tel Aviv, May 14, 1948, and the end of the British Mandate. An official ceremony is held every year on Mount Herzl on the eve of *Yom Ha'atzma'ut* where the speaker of the Knesset gives a speech. The Chief Rabbinate of Israel, along with many other religious authorities, has declared that this is one of the holidays when *Hallel* should be said.

For Jews living outside of Israel, celebration of *Yom Ha'atzma'ut* is a way to express solidarity with Israel. In Israel it is a national holiday, so almost everyone has the day off. National celebrations include parades, fireworks, heartfelt singing of *Hatikvah*, the national anthem, and additional prayers are offered for the nation.

Our *Ha'atzma'ut* celebration will be Friday, April 16, Shabbat Service, 8 PM.

I would like to commend the Rabbi and all the *B'nai Mitzvot* students who prepare so hard and with such enthusiasm for their big day. It is always so enlightening to see the future generation step up to the plate to carry on our Jewish heritage.
