## FROM THE PRESIDENT



Sometimes I hear the Rabbi say that we need to look at a subject and come up with a Jewish reply. I've got to be honest with you and say that I thought the only Jewish reply was, "Eat!" It surely seems like it is the Jewish response to so many things.

For many of us, certainly for me, some of our earliest memories of Jewish celebration revolve around food – Shabbat dinners, Passover and Break Fast meals. To me, the time shared around Aunt Golda's table with family was so precious, but I always knew we were there for a purpose.

Now this month as we celebrate *Sukkot*, it's not only that we should eat but also that we should eat outside in the *Sukkah*. Not only are we supposed to eat there with our family and friends, but we are also supposed to invite the Patriarchs and Matriarchs of our faith. We invite Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Aaron and David as well as Sarah, Rebekah, Rachel, Leah, Miriam, Deborah and Hannah.

Back in the day, two thousand years ago and more, *Sukkot* was a celebration at the end of the harvest. After the austere and serious fast of *Yom Kippur*, it was a real celebration. It is laced with all sorts of symbolism, from the *etrog* and *lulav*, the palm and myrtle representing the parts of our body to the *Sukkah* itself, sturdy but not permanent, reminding us of our place on earth.

Today, as it is every year, we have a beautiful *Sukkah* erected in the backyard of our Synagogue. A perfect opportunity exists to join many for the Community Shabbat Dinner before the Family Service on October 2. Contact the office for more details.

If you can't make it for that dinner, you are welcome to come at any time until the *Sukkah* is taken down. If you have a chance, if you're in "the city," grab some take-out and invite a friend or just enjoy the company of our ancestors. As you enjoy your kosher-style meal, no bacon cheeseburgers, please, in the *Sukkah*, I hope you can feel the comfort brought by thousands of years of Tradition.

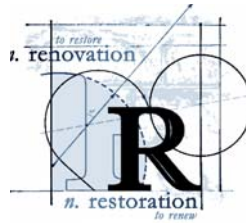

## SYNAGOGUE RENOVATION UPDATE



Be ready for a big change. Be prepared for the redesign of the main entrance of our Synagogue, with work to begin this month.

Plans were submitted and approved in early spring with a start date for this summer, but with the ebb and flow of 21st century manufacturing, the windows took too long to be manufactured and shipped. Therefore we delayed construction until after the High Holy Days.

Plans call for two center entrance doors, the elimination of the side doors, a new portico with stone facing, use of the same stone to cover the stucco at the front of the building and a window above the portico with a Jewish star to allow for more light in the lobby. The shrubs that are presently at the front will be moved and replanted. In reality we'll have a completely new look.

With good weather, it should take six weeks for the work to be completed.

While the work is in progress, entrance to the building will be either through the Religious School or the Boardroom door, directly off the parking lot.

Thank you for your support during this time as we enter this short and vital phase toward our new look.

The *Capy Selichot* bonfire this year was held indoors because of bad weather. Kids used the Pipe-Mazo's wood stove to "burn their sins."

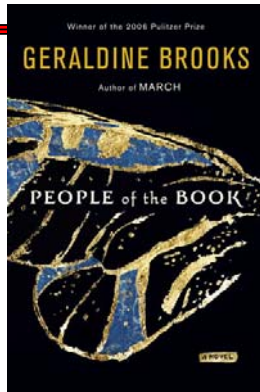
## OCTOBER BOOK CLUB

## RITUAL COMMITTEE INSIGHTS

All of us on the Ritual Committee hope that the High Holy Days services were inspiring and a time for reflection. We thank Rabbi Freelund, Jennifer and Megan. We also thank the numerous congregants who participated and those behind the scenes who helped services run smoothly. We appreciate everyone's hard work. Special thanks to David Silverman for all of his help.

Join us to enjoy the rest of the festival holiday season and see our evolving improvements with services, Onegs, sounds and experiences. Our family Shabbat will be during *Sukkot*, a biblical pilgrimage festival that occurs in autumn on the 15th day of *Tishre*. *Sukkot* is one of the three major holidays known collectively as *Shalosh Regalim*, pilgrim festivals when the Jews traveled to the Temple in Jerusalem. The holiday lasts seven days, including *Chol Hamoed*.

The *Sukkah* is reminiscent of the thatched huts where the ancient Israelites dwelt during their forty year wanderings in the desert after the Exodus from Egypt. Throughout the holiday, meals are eaten in the *Sukkah*. Some families sleep there. We shake the *Lulav* and smell the *Etrog*, wave the *Lulav* in all four directions, and up and down, to attest to God's mastery over all of creation. This ritual also symbolically voices a prayer for adequate rainfall over all the earth's vegetation in the coming year.

*Shemini Atzeret*, also known as *Simchat Torah*, immediately follows *Sukkot*. In Israel *Shemini Atzeret* and *Simchat Torah* are celebrated on the same day. In the Diaspora the second day of *Shemini Atzeret* is called *Simchat Torah*, the feast when we complete the yearly cycle of Torah readings and celebrate by dancing with the Torah. Join in the festivities as we march through the Sanctuary and rejoice.

The *Genizah* ceremony will be held on the grounds of the Cape Cod Synagogue October 4. Ritual objects and sacred books containing the name of God that can no longer be used and cannot be destroyed according to Jewish law are interred during the ceremony.

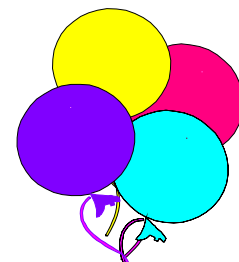
