## Mandated Silliness

As a *Purim* baby, I do feel a special connection to our most outrageous holiday. While I am no great believer in astrology, who knows what lasting effects a timely birth can have on a person? My birth at the start of a day of mandated silliness, outrageous costumes, irreverent humor, and merrymaking just might have inflected my destiny and personality. At any rate, it provides a convenient explanation for a sometimes bizarre sense of humor that continues to flow from me at nearly all times.

*Purim* has some aspects that seem to fly in the face of much of our tradition. It is irreverent, even to the point of inviting mockery of many things that we ordinarily hold dear. Perhaps chief among the “mandated transgressions” of *Purim* is that of drunkenness, an activity normally looked down upon. On *Purim*, our caution is tossed to the wind, and the Talmud tells us of one incident when some great rabbis drank to the point of obliviousness to the difference between the hero and the villain of the *Book of Esther*.

*Rava said: A person is required to drink wine on Purim until he does not know the difference between "Blessed is Mordecai" and "Cursed is Haman." Rabbah and Rabbi Zeira had their Purim feast together. After they became intoxicated, Rabbah got up and killed Rabbi Zeira. The next day he asked for divine mercy for him, and he came back to life. The next year, Rabbah said to Rabbi Zeira, "Come, let us have the Purim feast together." Zeira answered, "Miracles don't happen all the time!"*

- Babylonian Talmud, Megilah 7b

To be fair to Rabbah, our tradition is that his “killing” of Zeira was to encourage him to drink until he was actually in danger of dying. His prayer was for Zeira’s healing, which was mercifully answered. The whole story sounds more as if it came from a fraternity initiation than from the deeds of great scholars, which only underlines the point that *Purim* is truly a holiday apart. All of our expectations of a Jewish celebration are confounded.

On Saturday, February 27, we will have our own celebration of *Purim*, free of any danger to life or limb. All are invited to join us for a night of frivolity for a *Spiel*, *Megilah* Reading, many costumes, and of course *hamantaschen*. Join us in your wildest getup for a night of delight and a holiday that just can’t take itself too seriously!

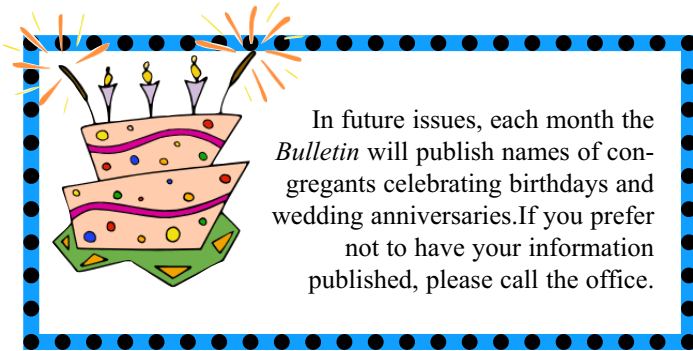

## FROM THE PRESIDENT



I've been having such a terrific time getting to know some of the great history of The Cape Cod Synagogue. Yes, Judaism is a five thousand year old tradition, but our little corner of it is 75 years young. I've had the privilege of getting to know some of our more senior members and hearing their stories of growing up in our community. The changing demographics of the area coupled with the societal changes of our country make it difficult even to imagine how the way life was for our forebears in Hyannis.

The complexion of the community was so different with a small number of families thrown together by their exclusion from many places here on the Cape. But hearing the evolution as the Jewish community coalesced and solidified gives a depth and texture to where we find ourselves today. I know there are many more of these stories.

I've learned of the varied Jewish backgrounds of those who have served in leadership, some converts into Judaism, some raised in very observant Conservative homes, others, Jews culturally, but with no real religious identification. Fascinating that we took so many paths and all ended up together. You may not know that our congregation started out as Conservative.

For many Reform Jews, we find it difficult to define ourselves. Rabbi Freelund comments it sometimes feels easier to say what we don't do as a definition of Reform Judaism. But when I read our Mission Statement and I listen to the stories of our people and our past, it becomes very clear. *What* we are is *who* we are - wonderful, warm, resilient, dedicated, ethical people sharing a common history, a brilliant future.

It has been so heart-warming to hear the stories from some of our congregants who have been around for a long time. These personal stories bring up such sweet images of now-grandparents as mischievous children getting kicked out of Hebrew school or hiding out on the fire escape to play hooky from Sunday school.

If you have a good story about your Cape Cod Synagogue experience, we'd love to hear it. We're putting together a memory book outlining our illustrious and personal history and are looking for your fun and fond memories. We have a great start and are gathering information, photos and your recollections.

There will be opportunity to send congratulations and good wishes to The Cape Cod Synagogue on this, our diamond anniversary. The celebration will culminate in the publication of this book and a gala affair on June 19, 2010. I hope we can all contribute stories and images to mark this milestone.

## RITUAL COMMITTEE INSIGHTS

Thank you to all who made the *Tu B'Shvat* Seder a success.

Next comes *Purim*, a festival that commemorates the deliverance of the Jewish people of the ancient Persian Empire from Haman's plot to annihilate them. The story where Haman casts lots to determine the day when to exterminate the Jews is recorded in the *Book of Esther*, *Megillat Esther*.

*Purim*, a celebration of a great victory and the survival of the Jewish people, is a holiday of fun, food and festivity for everyone. *Talmud* details the jovial character of this feast by stating that one should drink at *Purim* until he can no longer distinguish between the phrases *arur Haman* and *baruch Mordecai* – Cursed is Haman and Blessed is Mordecai, respectively.

Traditionally the *Book of Esther*, the scroll called *Megillah*, is read aloud twice on *Purim* at the Synagogue so that everyone can hear the story. One of the fun things about the reading is that when the name Haman is read, people stamp their feet and rattle noise makers to drown out the evil name of the villain.

Children and grownups also dress up in costumes. Traditionally they give gifts of food, *mishalach manot*, fruit, nuts and *hamantaschen*, to friends, family and neighbors. Also, remembering the poor and giving to the less fortunate is a *Purim* tradition.

Don't miss the *Hamantaschen* Bake-Athon and the *Megillah* reading!
