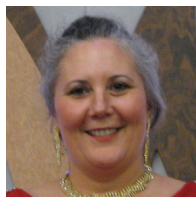

**NOTES FROM
CANTOR EMERITUS BRUCE MALIN**

Mendelssohn's 200th

This year is the 200th anniversary of the birth of the composer Felix Mendelssohn. In honor of this occasion, we will welcome Cantor Frederick Herman from New York City to our pulpit on July 17. Cantor Herman will deliver his *D'Var, Mendelssohn and the Jews* during Shabbat Service.

Cantor Herman is a long time friend of mine since Cantorial school, and I don't have to tell you how long ago that was. Because of his great interest in Felix Mendelssohn and the Mendelssohn family, Cantor Herman was asked to do a *D'Var Torah* at Congregation Emanuel in New York where he is a member. I've listened to the tape of his presentation and decided that it would be a wonderful opportunity for us all to have him come to our Synagogue and teach us about Mendelssohn, his music and his family.

In addition to Cantor Herman's *D'Var Torah*, I thought we should do something further to remember this great composer. What better way would there be to do that than to sponsor a concert of his music? While most of us are familiar with his *Midsummer Night's Dream*, *the Oratorio Elijah* and *Wedding March*, I would guess that many of us have not heard much of his large collection of chamber music.

The Music Fund will sponsor a special concert of Felix Mendelssohn's chamber music, Saturday, July 18, 7:30 PM. It will feature members of the Bristol Chamber Orchestra, lead by renowned violinist, Harris Shilakowsky, past concertmaster of several American Symphony orchestras. He has also been a guest leader of the London Symphony Orchestra, led by Michael Tilson Thomas, Sir Georg Solti and Sir Colin Davis. He and the other fine musicians will play music from Mendelssohn's string quartets, including one string quintet, rarely played, hauntingly beautiful.

Mendelssohn was a concert pianist and played a fine violin. His music is easy to listen to. Although his music is squarely in the Romantic period, it is highly influenced by the classical music of Mozart and Haydn. He was also responsible for the revival of compositions of Johann Sebastian Bach during Mendelssohn's lifetime of only 38 years.

I am sure we will learn much more about Mendelssohn and especially about his important family as well as enjoy some of the wonderful music beautifully played in our newly remodeled Sanctuary. Not to be missed, this is a reasonably priced concert. Tickets will be available at the Synagogue office and at Puritan Clothing stores.

I look forward to our *Mendelssohn Weekend* and look forward to seeing you there!

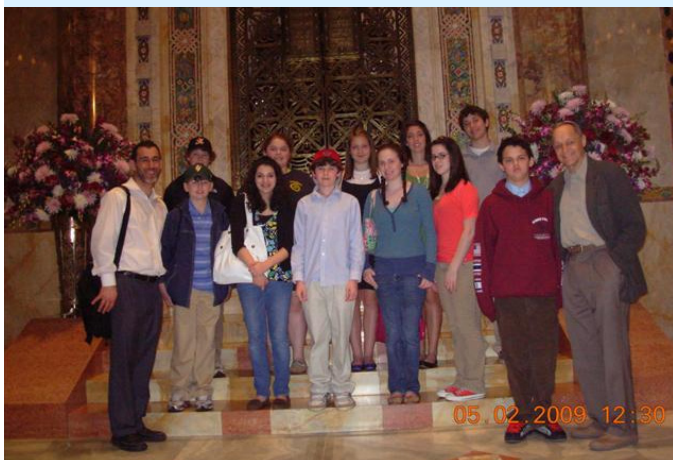

Our three day trip to New York City with eleven students was amazing. We went to the Lower East Side and had a tour of the Bialystoker Synagogue, ate pickles, bialeys and candy. Shabbat evening service was at B’Nai Jeshrun where we danced in the aisles to *L’chah Dodi*. Saturday morning we attended the service at Temple Emanuel. We saw Alfred Hitchcock’s *39 Steps* on Broadway. We shopped at Times Square, then moved down to Chinatown and Canal Street for more shopping and eating. Sunday we took the ferry to the Statue of Liberty. Lots of eating, walking and experiencing the sights and sounds of New York City.

In May we had an open house for our incoming eighth grade high school students. We explained the program, shared the curriculum and then food.

The sixth graders had two family workshops during May – the Wedding and the Funeral.

Young Reform Jews confirm their commitment to Judaism on *Shavuot*, personally to mark the day the Jewish people received the Ten Commandments with a ceremony that has become as common in the Movement as the *bar mitzvah*. Although *bar* and *bat mitzvahs* are commonplace now in the Movement, Confirmation was created in Germany as an alternative to the coming-of-age ceremony for males. Modern Confirmation services, held at the end of a student’s tenth grade year, honor and reflect Cape Cod Synagogue’s traditions even as they allow for the creative expression of the members of each class. The school year is spent studying the history and foundations of Reform Judaism as well as contemporary issues that affect us as Reform Jews. The year culminated with a beautiful Confirmation Service on *Erev Shavuot* created by Rabbi Freelund and students Jenna Arnowitz and Rebecca Segal.

We will honor all of our teachers and *madrichim* on Friday, June 5, at the Family Shabbat Service. Religious School ends for the year on Sunday, June 7, with an outdoor celebration.

RITUAL COMMITTEE INSIGHTS

We look forward to the Rededication of the Irene and Sidney Davidson Family Sanctuary on June 12. Come and join us for this celebration. Our choir, directed by Megan Anthony, will participate along with Jennifer Antebi, our Cantorial Soloist.

We hope you will accept an honor from one of our committee members. It is a great honor to be given an *aliyah* when the Torah is read in the Synagogue. It is important to fulfill this *mitzvah*, commandment, with dignity, both out of respect for God and Torah and out of respect for the congregation on whose behalf you will be blessing the Torah.

It is important to be familiar with the ritual of the *aliyah* and practice reciting the blessing aloud prior to the occasion. We will tell you in advance what number your *aliyah* is. There is one *aliyah* on Friday night and generally three *aliyot* on *Shabbat* morning.

Come forward to the Torah reading table as soon as you are called and provide your Hebrew name to the reader. The reader will open the scroll and show you where the reading begins. Take the *tzitzit*, corner fringes of the *tallit*, and touch them to the word the reader points out and kiss the *tzitzit*. Then you recite the first blessing. While the reader reads from the Torah, you may be asked to hold one of the wooden rollers to keep the scroll open. You are welcome to look into the scroll while the reader reads. This is your privilege. When the reader finishes reading the Torah, the reader will point out the last word with the *yad*, the pointer. Take the *tzitzit* into your hand, touch them to this word, kiss them and then complete the second blessing.

After you have completed the second blessing, move to the other side of the reader to make room for the next person called to the Torah. Having blessed the Torah, you are now honored with being invited to stay at the reading table for the next *aliyah*. At this time, or perhaps after the next *aliyah*, the Rabbi will read a prayer called a *Mi Shebeirach*. When the next *aliyah* is completed, you may return to your seat. It is customary to take a longer route back to your seat than that which you took to ascend to the *bimah*, signifying your reluctance to leave the Torah.

We hope our review of all honors has been beneficial. If you have any questions, please ask Rabbi Freelund or me.

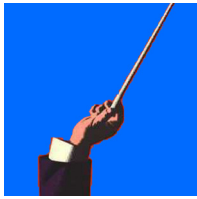
