Matters of the Soul

I have often been amazed by a certain generation of Reform Jews, who when asked, will announce that Jews don't believe in an afterlife. When I hear this, I always feel compelled to ask, "Really? Where did you learn that? I learned something different." Invariably I hear that this is what they learned growing up. What a shame that so many lost out on a whole arena of Jewish knowledge. Why?

Our shying away from teaching about the afterlife is rooted in a few places. The biggest one is our discomfort in talking about it. On the surface, it seems a little silly. After all, for all of the talking, who can prove anything? Until the first person comes back to tell us about it, what evidence is there for anything at all after we die? Isn't it just wishful thinking? We might call this the rational-skeptical approach.

Second is the awkward silence that ensues when somebody speaks about their own beliefs. What are we supposed to say? "Good for you! I'm so glad you believe that you will be reincarnated as a unicorn!" Our beliefs are so personal. It can be difficult to speak about them for fear of being misunderstood or perhaps even mocked.

Last would be life in America. With so many of our neighbors members of churches that have strong, definitive teachings about Heaven and Hell, our own seem a little vague. As with so many Jewish answers, we have a little of this and a little of that. With our own menu of options, it is hard to compete with someone else's religious certainty. In the end, it is easier for most to skirt the topic completely.

What a shame. Consider this question: What is it that makes us human? If you end up with some definition of a soul, then you are already on the path that leads us to an afterlife. If our souls are connected with our bodies, but not of them, then there must be something more. Our existence isn't so simple. The ancient rabbis were so sure of this that the immortality of the soul has been a bedrock teaching of Judaism for more than two millennia. Reform Judaism from the beginning has always taught that the soul is eternal. We have always been in consonance with our ancient tradition.

I invite you to join me in learning about the Jewish visions of the afterlife and how it is that we arrived at them. Beginning on November 17, 8:00 PM, we will take on the most important of questions and start to provide some answers. Jews don't believe in an afterlife? Come and find out otherwise!

FROM THE PRESIDENT



I never got to meet Herb Elins before he died. What I know is that he loved The Cape Cod Synagogue. In his day, Herb was President of the Board of Trustees. His commitment to our Synagogue would be shown by this alone. But that is not all there is.

Herb Elins made an ongoing commitment to our Synagogue. Every year in his last years, he contributed \$3000 to our budget strictly for Religious School scholarships. He started a fund in memory of his late wife Betty and made this a significant contribution year after year. His last conversation with Rabbi Freeland, promising his annual check, was only a month or so before his death.

Consider what this has meant over the years. This has meant that year after year, our students, our children, our future have had much needed financial support. This has allowed families who needed help to send their children for religious education with full dignity. Years of support. Uncounted numbers of recipients. The effect on our community is incalculable.

And now, in his death, Herb Elins' generosity, his dedication to the youth of our Jewish community is again a highlight. Herb Elins, of blessed memory, left \$10,000 to the Religious School Scholarships Fund (*Betty Elins/SJ*).

This gesture is noteworthy not only to remember a member of our community who has passed, but also to point out to us the possibility for posthumous giving. It is a beautiful way to be remembered. It is a powerful way to create our legacy. This is something we can all do.

The Cape Cod Synagogue has been a keystone for the Jewish community here. Honoring a place that has seen so many important moments in our lives and has been the home to so many of our lifecycle events is only natural. We have celebrated, mourned and learned together here.

Herb Elins who moved here after retirement and spent his last days in Arizona, far over the bridge, has given us a remarkable reminder of how deeply this place can affect us. His children were grown when he moved here. They never attended our Religious School, but he recognized the impact of our school on the local Jewish community.

I want to recognize the Elins family for their commitment to our community. The local impact of course created ripples that we in our time may never appreciate. The appreciation Herb Elins has shown is a beautiful reflection of what this Synagogue meant to him. The perpetuation of Jewish education and its lasting impact on our youth this affords is immeasurable. We thank Herb Elins.

RITUAL COMMITTEE INSIGHTS

We hope that everyone enjoyed the balance of the High Holy Day season. Thanks to all the volunteers who helped with the *Sukkah* as well as the *Simchat Torah* celebration and Consecration. Thanks to Sue Sheinkopf and the Sissenwine Fund for doing a beautiful job decorating our Sanctuary.

We held the *Genizah* ceremony on October 4 at our Synagogue. The *Genizah* is a depository at a synagogue or cemetery where worn out books and ritual objects containing the name of God that can no longer be used in normal rituals are buried. Jewish law forbids the destruction of such items.

David Silverman and I began preparation for the ceremony by packing all of the ritual items that had accumulated in the rear shed over the years. We also received items from individuals and collected ones from the Synagogue. Rabbi Freelund reviewed the items to clarify which were to be included. We placed various prayer books, *tefillin*, *tanach* and Torah spindles into 10 large containers to protect them when buried.

Maki Monument Company dug out the depository in the back lot of the Synagogue and placed a concrete cast into the ground.

During the ceremony we lowered the containers into the ground with help from David Silverman, Steve Heffron and Lee Michelove. Rabbi Freelund led the ceremony attended by all of the Religious School students and about 30 congregants. It was a moving experience for all of the generations that attended. At the conclusion a concrete cover was placed on top of the depository, and the plot was covered with soil and grass.

A permanent marker will be placed at a later date. As warranted, we will be able to open the *Genizah* in the future to add more items.

If you have comments or suggestions, please relay them to your Ritual Committee members as we all strive to improve our religious experience.


