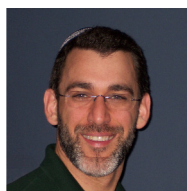

Genizah to Be Consecrated



One of the most famous passages in the Torah occurs in the *Book of Ezekiel*. Ezekiel was far from home, enduring the exile to Babylonia alongside the myriads carried off into captivity following the destruction of the First Temple. It was there that he received a prophetic vision from God, a vision of a valley filled with dry bones.

Then He said to me; "Son of man, can these bones become alive?"

I answered, "O Eternal God, You [alone] know."

He said to me, "Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, 'O dry bones, hear the word of the Eternal. So says the Eternal God to these bones; Behold, I will cause spirit to enter into you, and you shall live!

I will lay sinews upon you, and I will make flesh grow over you and cover you with skin and put breath into you, and you will live, and you will then know that I am the Eternal." (Ezekiel 37)

The image of inanimate bones again taking on flesh is a striking one. In Ezekiel's time it was to combat the sense of hopelessness in exile. As he learns later on, the bones represent the people of Israel ready to live again and return from their decades of banishment. But why bones? Of all the images that could have been used, why bones? The answer lies in Torah. What, after all, is the structure that gives us strength? Torah. After returning from Babylon, Ezra the Scribe establishes regular, public reading of the Torah as the foundation of communal life. When we people of Israel live, it is the Torah that gives us structure, stature, and form.

Consider for a moment the life of a *sefer torah*, a Torah scroll. In normal community use, it could last for a century or more. Tens or even hundreds of thousands of Jews may interact with it during that time, learning from its words, touching its mantle, saying the blessings before and after reading, lifting it, dressing it, opening their hearts and minds to its guidance. It is a beloved friend to them all. When it can no longer be used, we offer it full respect as a sacred object and place it in a *Genizah* or repository. All over the world Jewish communities have established *genizot*, to receive both *sifrei torah* and other sacred objects at the end of their useful life.. These objects are laid to rest with all the love and care we would use for an honored member of our community.

On October 4, we will establish a new *Genizah* for the use of the Cape Cod Synagogue. If you have sacred books or objects that are no longer useable, we will gather on October 4 to inter them in a specially lined grave at Woodside Cemetery in Yarmouthport. Our new *Genizah* is designed with the capacity for many years of use. Everyone is invited to join us that morning as we lay some of our treasured friends to rest.

FROM THE PRESIDENT



A Deed Is Only as Good as its Intention

As we enter this season of the High Holy Days, we are compelled to do the right thing...again. Our Sanctuary will be filled to capacity with almost all of our congregants and many others. Anyone who hasn't seen the Jerusalem stone on the

Bimah hasn't yet seen the renewed Sanctuary.

In this Season we are supposed to give and ask forgiveness with honesty and humility. We do this because there is something deep inside of us that knows it is important. We pause from our busy lives and take the time to go to these services as a visceral response to who we are. We are Jews.

When we ask for and give forgiveness, are we doing that because we are supposed to or because it comes from an understanding that we can be in an open relationship with our God in the holiest of days?

When we get our tickets for the High Holy Days, it's not an accident that they are tied to our fulfillment of our Financial Commitment. It provides an incentive for us to keep our commitment. But again, what is our intention?

Passover *Haggadot*, *tefilin*, and *tefilin* bags will also be accepted. If you have any of these items for disposal, please bring them to the site of the *Genizah* for their interment.

There will be a \$36 contribution to help maintain the *Genizah* for future use.



The Cambridge University Library in the UK is the home of the Taylor-Schechter Genizah Collection, a priceless accumulation of centuries-old Hebrew manuscripts and Judaica, recovered from the Cairo Genizah in 1896-97.


NEW BOOK CLUB DEBUTS IN SEPTEMBER

RITUAL COMMITTEE INSIGHTS

The High Holy Days season is upon us. Our committee is working hard to make our High Holy Days services run smoothly. We appreciate everyone's hard work. Special thanks to Al Drucker for all his help.

Selichot starts the Season on September 12. *Selichot* means forgiveness and refers to the penitential prayers recited by Jews prior to the onset of the High Holy Days season. It is a solemn and fitting preparation for ten days of reflection and self-examination.

On *Rosh Hashanah* three books of account are opened. The fates of the wicked, the righteous and others are recorded. The names of the righteous are immediately inscribed in the Book of Life. Most people are allowed a respite for ten days, until Yom Kippur, to repent and become righteous; the wicked are blotted out of the Book of the Living.

Repentance requires a change in attitude, thinking and behavior. It is a time to consider personal failings. During the afternoon on the first day of *Rosh Hashanah*, we will have our *Tashlich* service at Hyannis Harbor, and our sins are symbolically cast into the water.

The name *Yom Kippur* means Day of Atonement. It is a day set aside to afflict the soul, to atone for the sins of the past year. But *Yom Kippur* atones only for sins between man and G-d, not for sins against another person. To atone for sins against another person, we must first seek reconciliation with that person, right the wrongs we committed against them, if possible. That must all be done before *Yom Kippur*. The concluding service of *Yom Kippur*, known as *Ne'ilah*, is one unique to the day. The Ark is kept open throughout this service, thus we must stand throughout the service if we are physically able. There is a tone of desperation in the prayers of this service. The service is sometimes referred to as the closing of the gates. Think of it as the "last chance" to get in a good word before the holiday ends. The service ends with a very long blast of the shofar.

We thank all those who have accepted honors from one of our committee members. We hope our review of all honors has been beneficial. If you have any questions, please ask Rabbi Freeland or me.

Separately, please let us explain our *yahrzeit* guidelines. Every Shabbat we read the list of those whose *yahrzeit* occurs in the week looking ahead, from the day we are reading a full seven days forward. When we read a list of names Friday night, it is really Saturday in Jewish time, so we read the days from the current Shabbat through the sixth day of the next week.

As always, if you have suggestions, contact one of our committee members. We look forward to seeing everyone at High Holy Days services and wish everyone a Healthy and Prosperous 5770.

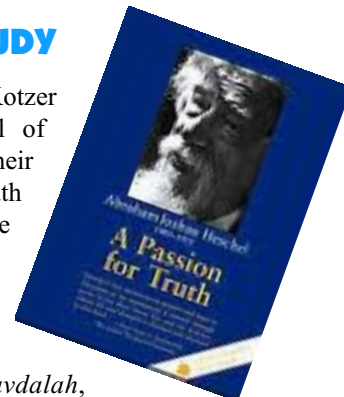

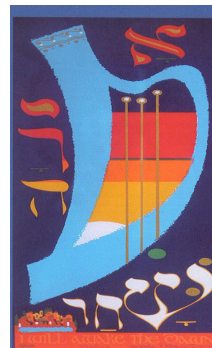
